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Patient and Family Engagement

At Children's Mercy Kansas City, the Patient and Family Engagement (PFE) Team champions the voices of patients and families, ensuring their perspectives shape every level of care and decision-making across the organization. This dedicated team is composed of staff members who are also parents, bringing both personal experience and insights gathered from over 200 Patient Family Advisors (PFAs) to foster a culture of collaboration, empathy, and continuous improvement.



The PFE Team serves as the central liaison for the Family Advisory Board (FAB) and 21 Patient Family Advisory Councils (PFACs) throughout the hospitals and clinics. These councils bring together parents, patients, and healthcare professionals to co-design solutions that enhance the quality, safety, and experience of care.

In addition to managing the advisory groups, the PFE Team leads several key initiatives:

· Family as Faculty Program:

Trains parents and caregivers to serve as Family Educators in Graduate Medical Education (GME) and the Nurse Residency Program (NRP). By sharing real-life experiences, they help future clinicians integrate patient- and family-centered care into everyday practice.

· Family Experience Tracers:

Engages directly with patients and families during their care journey to gather real-time feedback and insights that inform hospital-wide improvements.

· Hospital Integration

Participates in committees and workgroups across the organization to ensure that patient and family perspectives are embedded in hospital policies, practices, and innovations.

· Parent-to-Parent Orientation

Coordinates parent volunteers who visit inpatient units to welcome newly admitted families and share valuable information about available resources and support.

· Patient Family Advisors (PFAs)

Supports a network of over 200 PFAs—parents and caregivers who contribute their lived experiences to a wide range of improvement efforts, including parent panels, focus groups, and participation in strategic workgroups and committees.

· POPS (Parents Offering Parent Support) Program

Trains parent and former patient volunteers to serve as peer mentors, offering non-medical guidance and emotional support through one-on-one conversations via phone, text, or email.

Through these programs and partnerships, the PFE Team advances the principles of patient- and family-centered care. By working alongside hospital leadership, staff, and families, they help Children's Mercy Kansas City deliver care that is not only clinically excellent but also compassionate, inclusive, and responsive to the needs of every child and family. Together, we are Built for Kids – bringing hope, healing, and the promise of brighter tomorrows.

The Family Advisory Board (FAB)

The Family Advisory Board at Children's Mercy serves as a vital partner in shaping a culture where the voices of patients and families are not only heard but drive meaningful change. Composed of dedicated parents and caregivers, the board collaborates closely with hospital leadership to influence policies, programs and practices that reflect the principles of patient- and family-centered care. Through the lens of lived experience, members contribute meaningfully to the hospital's mission of creating a world of well-being for all children.

In FY25, the Family Advisory Board aligned its efforts with hospital priorities and identified three

key areas of focus: enhancing the patient and family experience in the Emergency Department, improving care coordination for medically complex children, and addressing access and wait times. FAB provided input on communication strategies and interventions related to ED wait times, advocated for maintaining home medication schedules during ED visits and supported the development of an inpatient needs list to better serve families prior to admission. In the area of care coordination, members learned about and offered feedback on the Care Navigation and Care Management programs, both aimed at supporting families with complex care needs. To support improvements in access, two FAB members participated in an Access Retreat, contributing the family voice to ongoing efforts to reduce wait times and improve timely care delivery.

As Children's Mercy prepares to transition electronic medical records to Epic, FAB members committed their time to join the EPIC Clinical Advisory Council, the EPIC Outpatient Advisory Council and the EPIC Digital Engagement team. These committees met regularly throughout the year, and FAB members ensured that the patient and family perspective remained central to discussions and decisions. Their involvement helped guide the design and implementation of tools and workflows that will ultimately support more connected, compassionate and efficient care.

Throughout FY25, the Family Advisory Board played an active role in advancing quality and safety efforts across Children's Mercy. Members contributed to the development and refinement of several Clinical Pathway guidelines, ensuring that family perspectives were integrated into clinical decision-making. FAB also provided valuable feedback on the implementation of several key initiatives, including the new Virtual Nursing program, inpatient screening processes for social determinants of health, and updated isolation procedures. Additionally, members reviewed and approved the Patient Rights and Responsibilities policy, helping to ensure that it reflects the values and needs of the families served by the hospital.

FAB members supported hospital-wide initiatives by providing thoughtful feedback on a variety of patient-facing materials. They reviewed and offered input on Patient Advocate letters to ensure the tone and content reflected empathy and clarity from a family perspective. The group updated the Visitor Tip Cards, making them more accessible and relevant for new families navigating the hospital environment. The FAB guidelines were also revised and approved.

Families continued to serve as integral partners in the education and professional development of physicians, nurses and staff, reinforcing the hospital's commitment to patient- and family-centered care. In collaboration with Graduate Medical Education, members of the FAB and Teen Advisory Board (TAB) hosted an orientation luncheon for the incoming resident class, introducing them to the foundational values of family partnership at Children's Mercy. Several FAB and PFAC members also served as family educators through the Family as Faculty program, offering residents a unique, non-clinical immersion

experience within their homes. Additionally, parents shared deeply personal narratives as part of a bereavement panel, providing invaluable insight into the experience of the loss of their child. Parent panels were also convened to support learning within the Nurse Residency Program and the Clinical Leadership Academy, further embedding the family viewpoint across disciplines.

In February, the FAB hosted a powerful Grand Rounds session titled, "Through a Parent's Eyes: Caring for Medically Complex Pediatric Patients," moderated by Dr. Doug Rivard. The session opened with the FAB Chair reading the poignant piece "Welcome to Holland," setting the tone for a deeply personal and impactful conversation. A panel of five FAB members then shared their lived experiences of raising children with medically complex needs, offering invaluable insight into the daily realities, challenges and triumphs of their journeys. The qualitative feedback from attendees underscored the significance of the session, highlighting the value of hearing directly from families and the importance of continuing to center their voices in clinical education and care improvement.

As grateful families, FAB and PFAC members found meaningful ways to give back to Children's Mercy through their involvement in philanthropic and advocacy efforts. Several members participated in fundraising events such as Red Hot Night, Big Slick, Dream Big Day and T-shirt sales helping to raise awareness and support for the hospital's mission. Beyond these events, other members extended their impact by serving on local, state and national committees, where they advocated for policies and programs aimed at improving children's health. Their dedication reflects a deep commitment not only to their own families, but to the broader community of children and families served by Children's Mercy.

To deepen their understanding of the communities served by Children's Mercy, FAB members heard a presentation on the hospital's Community Needs assessment. In addition to learning, members also took action to directly support inpatient families. They prepared and served lunch at the Ronald McDonald House, donated items from the organization's wish list, and toured the newly renovated space inside Children's Mercy.

In recognition for their continuous extraordinary service and dedication to Children's Mercy, two individuals were recognized with special awards. FAB member Allen Hall and Hem/Onc/BMT PFAC member Tracy Nagel were each highlighted as a Volunteer of the Month.

FAB and the PFACs collaborated on a range of impactful initiatives. These included active participation in numerous focus groups, advocacy for improved accessible parking across all locations, and assistance in planning the Transition Conference for patients and families. Together, the groups curated a recommended book list and used donated funds to fill the shelves in the Kreamer Resource Center. They also played a key role on the Patient and Family Seal of Collaboration taskforce, reinforcing their commitment to meaningful partnerships. Members of El Consejo and the Mental Health PFAC provided ongoing monthly input on the PATHWAY research project, with two members presenting findings at an international pediatric conference.

The FAB's held its 2025 annual meeting on April 1 in the Big Slick auditorium. More than 100 FAB, PFAC members, and staff attended in person or virtually. All Children's Mercy employees were also welcomed to join and learn more about how the hospital partners with the FAB and PFACs to elevate the patient and family experience. The meeting opened with heartfelt messages from two special guests: Diane Gallagher, chair of the Board of Directors, and Dr. Alejandra Quiroga, the new president and CEO of Children's Mercy.

Diane Gallagher shared:

"On behalf of all of our directors, we want to thank you—not only for your insights, your perspectives, and your feedback that you give to all of our staff—but also to recognize our tremendous gratitude that you are giving of your time while you are also managing the care of a child with a health issue. That is not lost on anyone who's been in that circumstance. It really does mean a tremendous amount to all of us that you are so gracious and generous with your time."

Dr. Quiroga added:




